

Cisco Chairman Visits Tuck

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Hanover, N.H.—On Monday, January 13th, John P. Morgridge, Chairman of the Board, Cisco Systems, Inc. will be speaking at the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth as part of the CEO Speaker Series sponsored by the Center for Digital Strategies and the Center for Global Leadership.

His presentation, "Under the Hood at Cisco: Technology and Culture," will address the challenges of globalization and the digital revolution. The event begins at 2:45 p.m. in Cook Auditorium.

Morgridge joined Cisco in 1988 as President and CEO. During his tenure as CEO, Morgridge grew the company from \$5 million in sales to over \$1 billion, and from 34 employees to over 2,260 employees. In 1990, he took Cisco public and in 1995 was appointed Chairman. In his role as Chairman, Morgridge dedicates his time to Cisco's education and government initiatives.

The CEO Speaker Series seeks to enhance the learning environment at Tuck and the Dartmouth community at large by giving students, faculty, administrators, alumni, and local residents an opportunity to interact with CEOs and senior executives on their most critical issues.

Previous CEO Speaker Series guests have included Jack Welch, former Chairman and CEO of General Electric, Indra K. Nooyi, President and CFO, PepsiCo, and Orit Gadiesh Chairman of the Board, Bain and Company.
