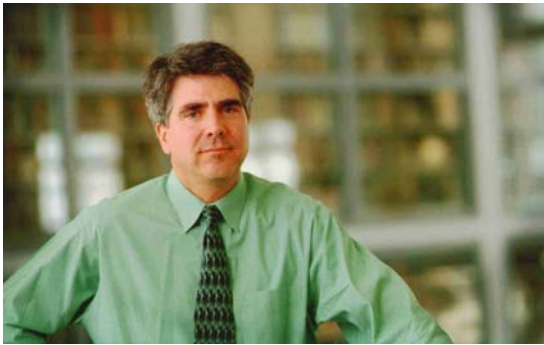


## M. Eric Johnson

M. Eric Johnson is Director of Tuck's Glassmeyer/McNamee Center for Digital Strategies and the Benjamin Ames Kimball Professor of the Science of Administration Management at the Tuck School of Business, Dartmouth College. His teaching and research focuses on the impact of information technology on supply chain management. Through grants from the National Institute of Standards and Technology, Department of

Justice, the Department of Homeland Security, and the National Science Foundation, he is studying how information security and trust effect supply chain relationships. His recent book, *Managing Information Risk and the Economics of Security* (Springer 2009) examines how organizations can protect their information assets. He holds patents on interface design and has testified before the US Congress on information security. He has published many related articles in the *Wall Street Journal*, *Financial Times*, *Sloan Management Review*, *Harvard Business Review*, and *CIO Magazine*. He is particularly interested in the supply chain challenges faced by industries with short product life cycles such as computers, toys, and apparel. Recently, he has been applying lessons from those industries to the supply chain problems found in humanitarian relief. His research articles have appeared in such academic journals as *Management Science*, *Operations Research*, *IEEE Security and Privacy*, *Communications of the ACM*, *Production and Operations Management*, *Journal of Management Information Systems*, *Manufacturing and Service Operations Management*, and *Transportation Science*.

Before joining Tuck, Johnson taught at the Owen Graduate School of Management, Vanderbilt University. He was previously employed by Hewlett-Packard Co. and Systems Modeling Corp. He has consulted for diverse companies such as Accenture, Alcatel-Lucent, Cisco, DHL, Hewlett-Packard, Mattel, Nike, Nextel, Nokia, Oracle, Pepsi, and The Parthenon Group. Johnson served on the boards of Evant (sold to Manhattan Associates), ISTS, POMS, and as the president of the POMS College of Supply Chain Management. He has also served on numerous editorial boards including *Electronic Markets*, *Production and Operations Management*, *Management Science*, *Interfaces*, *Operations Research*, *International Journal of Logistics Management*, and *Manufacturing and Service Operations Management*. He holds a B.S. in Engineering, B.S. in Economics, an M.S. in Engineering and Operations Research from Penn State University, and a Ph.D. in Engineering from Stanford University.
